You must be available to play at the times listed above.

Due to the expected large draw, special time requests are strongly discouraged. In the event we cannot meet your time request and you cannot play, you will be required to forfeit your scheduled match(es).

QUALIFICATIONS

Entrants must currently be enrolled as students (in grades 9 through 12) in an Oregon high school. Proof of enrollment may be required. Entrants must designate the name and the location of their high schools on their entry forms. Students need not have played in an OHSRL match or other qualifying event to play in this tournament. There are no limitations on the maximum or minimum number of players from a school.

ENTRY FEE

1st event = \$35 • 2nd event = \$10 (two events maximum)

ENTRY DEADLINES

OHSRL students: This individual entry and your check (payable to OJRA) are due to your coach by no later than **Wednesday, Jan. 9.**

OHSRL coaches: **1)** All of your school's individual entry forms (with your signature) and checks must be sent/delivered to Elizabeth Yee (make a copy for yourself). Packets must be postmarked by no later than **Friday, Jan. 11** (see address below). **2)** You will receive an official school roster via email from Elizabeth Yee. **3)** Completed school rosters must be emailed to Ed Boyle at EdB@ankrommoisan.com by **5 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 14.** Note: The earlier, the better!

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

All singles divisions are Olympic format. Players are guaranteed three matches in singles (bys and forfeits may count as matches). Doubles divisions are single elimination with a consolation round. Doubles players are guaranteed two matches (bys and forfeits may count as matches).

AWARDS

Singles/Doubles: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th in each Gold, Blue, Red and White round of eight or more; you must win at least one match to win a medal. Team awards: 1st, 2nd and 3rd for the top high school Boys' Teams, Girls' Teams and Overall Teams.

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Play governed by USA Racquetball rules.
2. USA Racquetball-approved eye guards and racquet wrist strings are required at all times, including warm-up and practice.
3. Tournament ball is green PROPENN.
4. All matches are two games to 15, tie-breaker to 11. **Exception:** Boys' Division 6, Girls' Division 6 and all Division 3 doubles are one game to 21 points.
5. You may enter a maximum of two events. One singles and one doubles or two doubles events.
6. Both players on a doubles team must be enrolled in the same high school.
7. Mixed doubles players must adhere to OHSRL mixed doubles serving rule.
8. Players **MUST** check in to tournament desk 30 minutes prior to scheduled start time. Ten minute-late forfeiture rules enforced at the discretion of tournament directors.
9. LOSER **MUST** referee the next match.
10. Tournament directors reserve right to expand/advance/delay match start times, observe round robin format if less than eight participants, combine divisions and/or modify type of match (best of three, one to 21, one to 15, etc.).

THIS TOURNAMENT IS SANCTIONED BY THE USA RACQUETBALL AND THE OREGON JUNIOR RACQUETBALL ASSOCIATION

All participants must be current members of the USA Racquetball (USAR) and the Oregon Junior Racquetball Association (OJRA). Memberships fees for persons 18 years and younger is only \$25 per year and include membership in the USAR and the OJRA, as well as the Oregon Racquetball Association. **BRING PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP.** If you are not on our list as a member, you must either show proof of membership (USAR card or canceled check) or pay for a new membership.

The USAR and the OJRA stress sportsmanlike conduct in all of their activities. Each participant at a USAR/OJRA-sanctioned event will be required to adhere to the USAR/OJRA Code of Conduct. Failure to do so may result in the forfeiture of your match, eviction from the tournament, loss of ranking and/or suspension from membership in the USAR/OJRA.

USAR JUNIOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Each participant and each participant's adult sponsor will be required to sign an official USAR code of conduct upon registering for the tournament.

In summary, the USAR Junior Code of Conduct provides: (1) A nightly "in-room" curfew of 11 p.m., unless accompanied by an

adult chaperone. (2) No possession or use of prescription drugs unless you are under a doctor's care (documentation required). (3) **NO POSSESSION OR USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS.** (4) Any physical damage to a hotel room or loss of nonperishable items in the room (e.g., towels, lamps, etc.,) will be paid for by those persons assigned to the room in which the damage or loss occurs. (5) Unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated, including, but not limited to: (a) Any act considered to be a violation of any federal, state, local or OJRA/ USAR law or rule. (b) Gross misconduct (e.g., inappropriate horseplay, stealing, swearing, etc.). (c) Unsportsmanlike conduct.

PENALTIES

Violation of the Code of Conduct may result in one or more of the following: (1) Full or partial restriction of movement at the tournament; (2) Written report to the OHSRL commissioner, board of directors or OJRA for further action; (3) Loss of opportunity to participate in future OJRA/USAR events or programs. (4) Forfeiture of match, loss of ranking points, eviction from the tournament or suspension from USAR membership. Eviction from the tournament will result in the player being sent home at the player's expense. For additional information, please contact the OHSRL commissioner.
